**Resolution to Redraw the Boundaries of ANC 8D and its Single Member Districts**

**Resolution No. 25-1**

To request redrawing Advisory Neighborhood Commission 8D's boundaries as well as those of its Single Member Districts.

Whereas ANC 8D is an autonomous entity of the Government of the District of Columbia.

Whereas Bellevue is an intact and historic neighborhood of the District of Columbia dating to the late-1890s with common interests.

Whereas the 2022 Ward 8 Redistricting Task Force originally split the Bellevue neighborhood across three separate ANCs.

Whereas resident Dionne Brown testified before the Council's Committee on Redistricting regarding The Advisory Neighborhood Commission Boundaries Act of 2022 (Bill 24-700) to demand the reunification of the neighborhood into a single ANC and South Capitol Street—its eastern border and main thoroughfare—as a hard boundary consistent with redistricting guidelines.

Whereas Dionne Brown worked with the then-Ward Councilmember as well as the 2022 Ward 8 Redistricting Task Force to implement the requested changes at the order of the Chair of the Council Committee on Redistricting.

Whereas ANC 8D's present Single Member Districts are neither compact, contiguous, nor consecutively-numbered as required by redistricting guidance.


Whereas SMD 8D03 is isolated from the rest of the Washington Highlands neighborhood and 8D08 is isolated from the rest of Congress Heights as part of ANC 8D.

Whereas Single Member District 8D02 remains perpetually vacant due to being wholly contained on Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling.

Whereas ANC 8D has been encumbered in establishing a quorum consistently due to the aforementioned.

Be it hereby resolved by Advisory Neighborhood Commission 8D in favor of redrawing its Commission and Single Member boundaries for optimal operations and representation.
